

Lesson 9: Stay Safe Online!

DCE Domain	Privacy and Security
Time	45 mins
Grade	Year 5
Learning Outcome	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I can protect myself and others to stay safe online.
Success Criteria	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> I can identify online safety issues. <input type="checkbox"/> I can list ways of addressing online safety issues.
Key terms	Privacy - the right to store, share and display your own content online Security - the protection of one's own personal data and devices
Description	This session highlights the importance of being safe online and engages the students in a discussion to help them understand. The students will demonstrate their understanding by creating a slogan about what they discussed in class.
Resources	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PowerPoint Presentation: Stay Safe Online • Poster creation Web 2.0 tool or app such as Picollage, PicSay, Workspace • Tablet lesson Profile: DCE 9 Stay Safe Online!
Procedure	<p>Introduction: The teacher uses Slide 1 of the PowerPoint: Stay Safe Online to introduce the lesson. The teacher asks the students to talk about their online activities (Slide 2).</p> <p>Development:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The teacher leads a discussion about staying safe online using the PowerPoint presentation. 2. Following the discussion, the students are asked to come up with a slogan based on one aspect related to online safety that they have learned from this lesson. <p>Conclusion: The students share their slogans with the class. They are also invited to share any questions/concerns that they might have which can be addressed to a guest speaker.</p>
Follow-up activity	The teacher shares the slogans with the school community. The school can invite a guest speaker to answer any questions and queries that the students may have. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Be Smart Online
